After completion of the Psychology and General Education requirements additional hours (electives) will need to be completed to reach 128 hours. Adding a minor or another major can be used to achieve the 128 hours. All degrees require at least 128 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative grade average of “C” (2.00) or the minimum grade average specified by individual program requirements (if higher). A minimum of 30 semester hours (12 of which must be on the 300 & 400 level and 15 of which must be in the student’s major) must be taken in residence. A second bachelor’s degree requires an additional 30 semester hours above the 128 hours.
