

Health, Human Performance and Athletic Center

The new Health, Human Performance and Athletic Center is progressing quickly, and once completed, it will be one of the top facilities in the GPAC and the NAIA. The arena portion of the facility is scheduled to open in 2009. Offices for coaches, professors and support staff as well as the Hall of Fame room and other VIP spaces are included. Locker rooms and weight rooms will serve those who play in the 2,000-seat performance arena. The field house includes a 200-meter track and a multipurpose infield with spaces for basketball practice courts, long/triple jump pits and pole vault, discus and shot put areas. The wellness center will include a renovation of the current gym as well as an indoor pool and a fitness center equipped with cardio machines and space for aerobics and other classes.

Music Center

Concordia's 40,000 square foot music center houses two large rehearsal studios, five classrooms, a 250-seat recital hall, a computer music laboratory with 16 work stations, 13 pipe organs, three Steinway grand pianos, a piano lab and 24 practice rooms. The Music Center's north-south wing contains no windows, making the building sound-proof and helping control temperature and humidity fluctuations which could damage organs and pianos. In the summer of 2008, a new 38-rank Casavant organ was installed and dedicated.

Osten Observatory

Osten Observatory was erected in 2002 after a donation from Dr. Reuben '33 and Doris Osten. The domed observatory houses a 15-inch telescope, which is computer controlled, making it easy to find stars, planets and constellations. The observatory is used by science students as well as for community viewing.

Outdoor Chapel

The Outdoor Chapel is the perfect setting for outdoor worship. Tiered seating for 250 people facing an outdoor fire pit, cross and beautiful countryside provide the ideal seating for any occasion.

Reflecting Garden

The Reflecting Garden was created in the summer of 1995 as a gift to the students, faculty and staff of Concordia. Art professor Don Dynneson donated his time and talents to create this place for quiet reflection.

Sculptures

The Open Book Sculpture

Concordia art professor Reinhold Marxhausen created the Open Book sculpture in 1961, shortly after the dedication of Link Library. The Open Book is one of three sculptures on the campus grounds which depict the three Persons of the Holy Trinity. This piece symbolizes the Holy Spirit, Author of Scriptures. Marxhausen created the sculpture by digging a form into the ground and filling it with concrete. A crane was used to lift the sculpture out of the ground and onto its base. The rocks set in the ground by the base came from the shores of Lake Michigan.


The Creation Sculpture

Concordia alumnus Dr. Arthur Geisert created this sculpture, which depicts the Genesis account of creation through images cast on a metal cylinder. Geisert, a 1963 graduate, has enjoyed a successful career as an illustrator and author of children's books.

The Son of Man, Be Free Sculpture

Concordia completed its triangle of sculpture representing the Persons of the Holy Trinity in 1972, when nationally renowned sculptor Paul Granland was commissioned to create this piece. Son of Man, Be Free symbolizes Christ's act of breaking the bonds of sin and death for us through His death and resurrection.


