## **2015 SEASON OUTLOOK**





After a 2014 season filled with close calls (five losses by seven points or less), Concordia looks to turn the page with a more experienced squad. While the offensive line is a question mark heading into fall camp, the Bulldogs are well-stocked at the skill positions despite the loss of record-set-

ting quarterback Von Thomas. Seventh-year head coach Vance Winter sees a team long on speed and athleticism.

"I think this will be a team that can really run," Winter said. "We're still going to have some inexperience at spots, but I also feel like this is an athletic group. I think this is one of the more athletic teams (we've had). I felt the same thing last year. I thought we had a bunch of guys who were athletic and could run around. The experience (gained) is big."

A potentially explosive offensive will be powered by the likes of junior running back Bryce Collins (1,559 all-purpose yards in 2014) and sophomore receiver Jared Garcia (program record 11 touchdown catches in 2014). At quarterback, sophomore TJ Austin is the frontrunner to fill the shoes of Thomas. Sophomore corner Tarence Roby represents the team's biggest playmaker on defense. He returned both a fumble and a kickoff for a touchdown last season.

Concordia returns six starters on offense and seven on defense from a 2014 squad that went 5-6 overall and ranked 29th nationally offensively (401.6) and 48th defensively (384.7).

## Quarterbacks

After red-shirting his first year on campus in 2013, TJ Austin (Angleton, Texas) got his feet wet last year by appearing in five games. He threw for 440 yards, posted a 4-1 TD-INT ratio while running for 168 yards. Now he's the likely replacement for Von Thomas, who owns the majority of significant passing records in school history. Says Winter, "We were really pleased with how TJ finished and played the last few games. I think that was a big boost for everybody with how he came in and competed and did well. He's a different type of guy than Von and brings a lot of things from a confidence standpoint and leadership standpoint that were noticeable."

Austin (6-0, 225) will be pushed in camp by senior Garrett Folchert and sophomore Riley Wiltfong. Folchert also saw action at quarterback in five games last season and understands the playbook as well as anyone on the roster. Wiltfong is an up-and-comer who brings plenty of athleticism to the position. Winter says he feels comfortable going to any of his top-three signal callers.

## **Running Backs**

Concordia believes it possesses one of the NAIA's top running backs in junior Bryce Collins, who last season became the fifth Bulldog ever to eclipse 1,000 rushing yards. The native of Boerne,



Texas, has piled up 1,720 rushing yards and 19 total touchdowns over his first two collegiate seasons. Says Winter of the 5-foot-10, 200-pound back, "Bryce has had just an awesome offseason and has worked relentlessly. He's one of the hardest working guys I've ever been around. He's made really noticeable improvements in the weight room."

Backing up Collins will be fellow junior Demarques Saulberry (5-9, 200), another well-built, physical runner. Saulberry went wild for 171 rushing yards in Concordia's season-ending win over Briar Cliff. There will also be competition from sophomore Jordan Slough, a star at Doniphan-Trumbull High School who was sidelined by injury in 2014.

## Receivers

This position got a huge boost last season from Jared Garcia, who made for an exceptionally difficult matchup in the red zone. Garcia (6-3, 205) caught 44 passes for 650 yards and a school-record 11 touchdowns in 2014 as the favorite target of Thomas and Austin. Says Winter, "Last year as a freshman feeling his way through the whole season he still did some great things. I think Jared has the ability to be one of the more dynamic players in our league." Winter also loves the potential of Winchester, Calif., native Carey Harrison (5-11, 170), who hauled in 14 balls for 188 yards and a pair of scores last season as a freshman. With Garcia and Harrison the likely top two, that leaves senior Riley Herren (6-0, 190) and a host of others in the mix for playing time.

#### **Tight Ends**

This position is in good hands with the return of senior Josh Slechta and junior Seth Fitzke, a second team all-conference selection last season. Slechta opened 2014 sidelined by injury but worked his way back to the field and then won a weight throw national title during indoor track season. Fitzke is a punishing blocker who continues to improve his receiving skills. Said Winter, "That's as good of a tight end pair as there is anywhere. They're both physical, athletic tight ends. To have two guys like that is a huge boost to us and allows us a lot of versatility offensively."

#### Offensive Line

Gone are three linemen who earned some form of all-conference recognition in 2014. That leaves left guard Ben Balduc as the anchor of a group that will have a vastly different look. With the skill positions loaded with talent, this unit may hold the key for an offense that has improved each season under fourth-year coordinator Curran White. Said Winter, "This group is a big question going into the fall but we have some great candidates and quality guys, so we'll see how it shakes out."

#### **Defensive Line**

Kyle Rakow has graduated after an impressive 2014 season that saw him collect second team all-conference recognition. On the bright side, senior Michael Gill (6-0, 260) and juniors Ronald Jackson (5-11, 315) and Trey Barnes (6-2, 245) return to provide a strong nucleus. Gill registered 9.0 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks last season. Jackson is a space eater who Winter says is on his way to being a dominant nose guard. Meanwhile, Barnes has found a home on the line after having played running back and linebacker in his first two collegiate seasons.

## Linebackers

Winter admits that this position must pick up its play this fall. Inside backer Michael Hedlund (6-1, 215), who came to Concordia



as a quarterback, made the most of his playing time last season. The opportunistic native of O'Neill, Neb., came up with five interceptions in 2014. Plenty of others will compete for spots, including sophomore Zach Jackson (5-11, 235), senior Clay Mauro (6-0, 225), senior Brandon Namuth (6-2, 215) and junior Patrick Skwara (6-0, 215).

"The big thing is so many guys got an opportunity to play and for a lot of them it was their first real college football experience," Winter said. "I think going into the offseason they took a lot from the experiences they had last season. I don't think it's any secret that we have to be better. We have to play better, but this spring I was really excited."

## **Defensive Backs**

The defensive backfield is loaded with returning starters. Corners Tarence Roby (6-3, 205) and D'Mauria Martin (5-11, 175), both sophomores, are budding stars. Roby showed an immediate ability to make big plays, as evidenced by his five interceptions, eight pass break ups and two returns for touchdowns. On the other side, Winter says Martin has the potential to be a shutdown corner. At safety, senior Tait Sibbel (6-2, 210) enters his fourth season as a starter. He has posted 181 tackles and eight interceptions in his career. Also in the mix are sophomore Sebastian Garces (6-1, 190) and junior Matt Keener (5-9, 185). Says Winter, "I like our secondary quite a bit."

## **Special Teams**

The Bulldogs are set at kicker with senior Adam Meirose (two-time all-conference selection) and at punter with senior Sandy Fisher (37.5 average). Meirose (15-for-21 on field goals over the past two seasons) continues the program's run of solid field-goal kicking. Winter likes his kick return options, which include Collins and Roby, but has identified punt returner as an offseason priority. Overall, Concordia has put together another solid special teams

## **BIO**

Vance Winter completed his sixth season as head football coach at Concordia University in 2014. He was named to his current post in December of 2008. He owns a career record of 28-37 overall and 22-34 in GPAC action in his six seasons as head coach of the Bulldogs.

Since his promotion to head coach, Winter has progressively built up the program into a playoff contender. In 2013 the Bulldogs began the season at 6-0 and rose as high as No. 14 in the national rankings. Concordia finished 7-4, marking the program's first winning season since 2001. The Bulldogs also appeared among teams receiving votes early in the 2014 campaign.

Over a 20-game period from the middle of 2012 through 2014, Winter guided Bulldog football to a record of 13-7. Included in that stretch was a momentum-building upset of No. 11 Northwestern on Oct. 13, 2012. Then on Oct. 12, 2013, the Bulldogs took down No. 22 Nebraska Wesleyan, 19-3, in the NAIA Game of the Week. Concordia completed 2013 with a record of 3-1 against its GPAC Nebraska rivals. The Bulldogs then defeated two ranked teams in 2014 - No. 15 Sterling College and No. 24 Dakota Wesleyan.

Winter has surrounded himself with a top-notch coaching staff. He brought in offensive coordinator Curran White prior to the the 2012 season and in less than three years, the offense broke a program record for total yards per game in a season. On the other side of the ball, coordinator Patrick Daberkow has helped make the defense one of the NAIA's best.

While also serving as quarterbacks coach, Winter oversaw record-breaking quarterback Von Thomas. The senior signal caller piled up 6,988 yards of total offense over the past three seasons. Thomas finished his career with program single-season records for passing touchdowns (21), total offense (2,508), completions (197), passing attempts (334) and completion percentage (59.0). He owns program career records for total offense (7,260), total touchdowns (65), passing touchdowns (49), completions (510) and pass attempts (960).

## Star power: skill players spark Bulldog 'O'

Record-breaking quarterback Von Thomas completed his impressive run at Concordia in 2014, but the Bulldogs may only be at the beginning of a golden age for offensive prowess. Last year's squad broke a program record for yards of offense per game – and it did so with an underclassmendominated set of skill players.

While Thomas missed time late in the season due to injury, the misfortune allowed redshirt freshman TJ Austin to get his feet wet at quarterback. Austin will be the leading candidate to replace Thomas this fall for a Bulldog group that will lean upon a young and productive offensive core that includes junior running backs Bryce Collins and Demarques Saulberry and sophomore receivers Jared Garcia and Carey Harrison (all native Texans with the exception of Harrison).

"We have some really good, young skill players," said offensive coordinator Curran White, who just completed his third season on the coaching staff. "Bryce Collins, Jared Garcia and Carey Harrison are all explosive players. They make us a more dynamic offense than what we were before. They're all young and they all have the ability to get better and better."

The infusion of big play receivers coupled with the emergence of Collins at running back gave the Bulldogs the types of home run hitters they lacked in previous seasons. In 2013 the team's longest play from scrimmage covered a mere 36 yards. Things changed this past season when Thomas fired 10 touchdown passes that covered 20 yards or more. He also ran for a 74-yard touchdown at Hastings in what ended up being Concordia's longest play from scrimmage in 2014.

More often than not, Thomas looked for Garcia when the Bulldogs reached the red zone. Garcia broke a program single-season record by catching 11 touchdown passes, including a season long 65-yard scoring strike versus No. 12 Northwestern on Oct. 18.

"It definitely makes it easier to call plays when you have that guy who can go up there and get those 50-50 balls," White said. "You don't have to make a perfect pass to Jared. You can just throw it up to him.

"I think he can develop in other areas like his blocking, but he's a real asset for us."

Concordia piled up more than 400 total yards on five occasions with a season high of 548 yards in the win over Dordt. The Bulldogs also ran for greater than 200 yards six times behind Collins, who became the fifth player in program history to eclipse 1,000 rushing yards in a season. He racked up six games of more than 100 yards on the ground.

"We had some really great moments offensively throughout the year in terms of guys really stepping up," head coach Vance Winter said. "We had some newcomers emerge. I thought up front our offensive line played solid football all year. I think it was huge how (tight end) Seth Fitzke became a really dominant blocker. He had an outstanding



overall year.

"Bryce had a very good freshman year, but he really stepped up as a sophomore. Bryce was one of the best players on the field in every game. And at receiver, Jared and Carey still have a ton of room for growth. Those guys have a great future. I'm really excited about them."

Austin saw extensive action over the final three games, completing 28 of 59 passes for 440 yards, four touchdowns and one interception. He also ran 30 times for 126 yards, giving him 566 combined total yards. His solid late-season work eases some of the concern that arises from the graduation of Thomas.

White liked what he had seen from the rifle-armed Austin in practice, but the Angleton, Texas, native's ability to perform on Saturdays provides a higher comfort level in looking forward to 2015.

"It was good to see him step in and perform well," White said. "He looked good in practice, but you never know for sure how a guy will respond in games, especially at quar-

terback. TJ did a nice job in the opportunities he got. It was an obvious positive for him to play well and show what he can bring to the table."

With Concordia stocked at the skill positions, the offseason focus will center upon retooling an offensive line that loses four senior starters, including first team all-conference right guard Josh Powell. The development of the big guys up front will be a key to complimenting a group of skill players that may be as good as any since Bulldog football began in 1925.

"We've been recruiting towards a balanced offense," White said. "We've put ourselves in position where we can spread people out and throw the ball or pack it in and pound the ball on the ground."

Winter says the overall talent in the program is at its highest since he became head coach in 2009. Winter believes Collins and company will successfully put behind a 2014 season that included plenty of frustrations with five losses coming by a margin of six points or less. Said Winter, "We were much better than what our record showed."


