

Head Coach Profile: Drew Olson

Drew Olson is in his 10th year as head coach of Concordia University women's basketball in 2015-16. The program's all-time winningest coach (248-87), Olson guided the Bulldogs to their first-ever national title game appearance in 2015.

Over the previous four seasons, Olson has directed his teams to a combined four GPAC titles (tournament and regular season), four national tournament trips, two national semifinal appearances, an overall record of 119-21 and a GPAC mark of 68-12. Both the 2014-15 (35-3) and 2011-12 (34-3) squads eclipsed the 30-win mark. Concordia enters the 2016 national tournament with an active streak of 65-consecutive top 25 rankings.

Olson has led the Bulldogs to national tournament appearances in eight of the past nine years. His eight

national tournament trips and 11 national tournament wins are the most among all coaches in the history of Concordia women's basketball. He owns a record of 11-7 at the national championships with one national championship game, two semifinal and two quarterfinal appearances. Named the 2012 GPAC coach of the year, Olson garnered midlands/state college coach of the year honors from the Lincoln Journal Star and Omaha World-Herald in 2015. He's twice been tabbed a Women's Basketball Coaches Association region II coach of the year (2012 and 2015).

A native of Omaha, Neb., Olson was a three-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs in both basketball and tennis. During his basketball career he helped the Bulldogs make two NAIA National Tournament appearances, win three Concordia Invitational Tournament (CIT) titles and capture a GPAC tournament championship. He was honored individually as an NAIA All-America honorable mention selection and a NAIA Scholar-Athlete. He was also a GPAC All-Conference selection and the Concordia Athlete of the Year in 2003. Olson's coaching resume includes a stop at Bellevue University (Bellevue, Neb.) where he served as an assistant men's basketball coach for three seasons.

During Olson's time at Bellevue, the Bruins compiled a record of 74-21 and made three NAIA National Tournament appearances, finishing as national runner-up once. In addition, they won two Midlands College Athletic Conference (MCAC) regular season and tournament titles.

Coaching is a familiar career choice for the members of the Olson family as his father, Rich, has coached girl's basketball at the high school level for more than 30 years. Drew's brother, Jarrod, is also in the college coaching ranks, taking over as head women's coach at California Baptist in 2012 after six seasons as head coach at Florida Southern College.

Drew and his wife M'Leigh reside in Seward with their daughter Adelyn and son Jacoby.

"It was the most fun I have ever had coaching. It was an incredible group to work with all season. They were special. They had a togetherness and a collective toughness that is rare. They found ways to win. Most importantly, they were a great group of teammates that loved each other. It's bittersweet how it ended, but I think we will remember the greatness of the team more." -Drew Olson

The 2014-15 Concordia women's basketball team provided a lifetime's worth of thrilling moments while capturing the sentiments of passionate Bulldog alums and fans that swarmed the national tournament in Sioux City, Iowa, in droves. The 2015 run to the title game was bigger than the team. It transcended the 94 feet of hardwood that served as its stage. Each national tournament victory triggered Bulldog pride that swelled like the sting of an angry hornet's nest.

Named GPAC player of the year in each of her final two collegiate seasons, do-it-all point guard Bailey Morris justified the price of admission all by herself. The native of Clay Center, Neb., never stopped torching the nets. She killed opponents with her crossover, her did-I-really-just-see-that dimes and her sheer knack for putting points on the board. She ended her career with a program record 2,054 points over 136 games. Said Morris, "I'll graduate and move on with my life, but the pride of being a Concordia Bulldog will be with me wherever I go."

Shortly after the 2014-15 season came to an end, after Morningside held off Concordia, 59-57, in the national title game and the confetti rained down from the Tyson Events Center rafters, Olson offered the following reflection:

"It still stings and I think it always will. And it should, if it means anything to you. However, when I look back on the season, I know it was an amazing journey. It was so fun. On the court, the team had maturity in their preparation, a toughness that never allowed them to lose composure in close games or tight situations, and the best part was how well they played together. They were an unstoppable force at times. And off the court, they were a blast. This team was fun to be around, and we have so many memories that 20 years from now will stick way more than the wins and losses."

WRAGGE TAKES ON STARRING ROLE IN DEBUT

Enter Quinn Wragge. The next great Concordia women's basketball player.

Few freshmen are asked to carry the load in the way that rookie Quinn Wragge has for Concordia women's basketball in 2015-16. Few freshman can dominate a game the way that the Crofton native can. Few freshman score 29 points on the road against the top team in the GPAC and then a couple weeks later chase down 18 rebounds.

Simply put by head coach Drew Olson after a late-season home win, "Quinn's phenomenal."

The lanky 6-foot product of Crofton High School uses her gazelle-like quickness to beat opponents for easy buckets in



transition. She possesses the handles of a guard, impressive touch around the basket and a winning pedigree complete with three high school state titles to her credit. She's also mature beyond her years. Says Olson, "She's got a great demeanor. Nothing ever rattles her."

The cucumber cool Wragge is on track to become the first freshman to lead the team in scoring since Concordia Athletic Hall of Famer Sarah Harrison did so in 2001-02. Olson has asked her to play more minutes than any other Bulldog this season, and she's delivered in a big way.

"I wasn't expecting that actually," Wragge said of her hefty workload. "I wanted to come in and do my best and help this team in any way that I could. I wasn't really expecting myself to have this role. All the girls have been great helping me out and getting me to where I need to be. I'm thankful that they're supportive of me in this role."

Daughter of Mark Wragge, who tallied 1,821 career points at Doane, Quinn is the face of Bulldog basketball present and future. She's exactly what Olson's program needed after graduating a pair of All-Americans from last season's national runner-up team. Without Wragge, the season very likely would have ended in February.

Olson won an intense recruiting battle to land his next star, who turned down interest from several rivals, including Briar Cliff, Hastings, Doane, Morningside and Mount Marty.

"It was a really tough decision just as it is for everyone," Wragge said. "When it came to choosing Concordia, I loved Coach Olson most out of all the people that were recruiting me. I also really like track. When I came here they said I could do both which was a pull for me. And I didn't want to be that far from home. It's only two, two-and-a-half hours which isn't that bad. At first it seemed like it was so far.

"I liked coach. I liked the team and I liked the Christian aspect of it a lot. Those were my main reasons for coming."

Little did she know, she would become the immediate centerpiece of a fifth-straight national tournament team at Concordia. There would be no easing into her freshman season. That point was made especially clear when standout guard Mary Janovich went down with a torn ACL at practice on Jan. 18.

That news dealt a significant blow to a young team still in the learning process. That gave Wragge the opportunity to take off. It's your team now, kid. All she did was lead the Bulldogs to wins in eight of their next 11 games. During that stretch she dominated the Concordia Invitational Tournament, earning

MVP honors. CIT provided another example of the team's resilience with it fresh off a rough home loss to Doane that saw Wragge go 3-for-9 from the floor.

Wragge purposely caught amnesia. It's like that game never happened. Her maturity shined through. She's believed all along despite the names that departed after last season and through the injury to Janovich.

"We knew things were going to be different. I think we all thought we could still be a good team," Wragge said. "Coach was really big on that. He was telling us that people aren't going to believe in you this year. He was like, 'let's go prove them wrong. I believe in this team and I hope that you guys do, too. Let's show them that we still can be that team.""

Wragge and the Bulldogs enter the tournament in more of an underdog role in 2016. But don't expect the big-game tested Wragge to be intimidated. She showed she can flourish in hyper-charged environments like that of CIT and she's found comfort in her role as Concordia's top scorer.

"I'm definitely excited for (the national tournament)," Wragge said. "State is one of the best atmospheres. I think being (in Sioux City) will be like that. I'm glad that I have that experience. I also think that CIT helps a little bit. It's probably a little different, but it's the kind of crazy atmosphere where everyone is ready to go. I think it will be a lot of fun."

RELENTLESS-LY GOOD

Concordia waved goodbye to one of the most accomplished senior classes in program history following the 2014-15 national title game and then welcomed a series of question marks. Some observers outside the program may have asked the valid question: would 2015-16 be a rebuilding year for head coach Drew Olson's powerhouse program? Then the season kicked off with the Bulldogs blowing past a pair of top-25 ranked teams, including a Jamestown squad it had met in the 2015 national quarterfinals. The answer: no.

"Relentless." That's the buzz word fashioned to the back of this year's warm-up shirts. It's a fitting word to describe a program that has watched stars like 2014-15 national player of the year Bailey Morris come and go, then keep on winning. Lose the likes of Morris and fellow All-American Tracy Peitz. Gain freshman sensation Quinn Wragge and redefine the team with a balanced approach. It's worked.

Says Olson, "I thought that we'd actually be a tougher team to guard because no one's going to know. If you're scouting us, who are you really going to guard or key in on? I thought that would be an advantage for us. We've learned that we don't need a go-to player at the end of games to get baskets. We just need to continue to play team basketball and look for the best available shot."

Relentless. That's what Concordia has been, even in the face of trying moments. It lost perhaps its most dependable player when Mary Janovich suffered a torn ACL in practice on Jan. 18. Two days later the Bulldogs moved on and edged 10th-ranked Hastings, 75-72. A week later everything went wrong in a stunning 91-55 home loss to rival Doane. Concordia followed with wins in seven of its next eight games to essentially lock up its fifth-straight journey to the national tournament.

"Resilient is a good word," Wragge said. "That was a setback. It was not part of the plan. That was just a bad game. Coach was good at bringing us back in. We were frustrated and upset with it but when it came down to it you have bad games. You can't focus on one loss. It was a good spot for us to get refocused. We got going on a good streak after that."

While Wragge has become a star in the second half of the season, the Bulldogs remain a well-rounded team featuring a host of role players with the green light to hoist threes as they see fit. They've also become nastier defensively. During the crucial late-season three-game homestand, Concordia held its opponents to a combined shooting percentage of 34.2.

No matter what happens this March, Concordia women's basketball will be back. You know, relentless.
