** Completing the above requirements will meet the requirements for a BA in Communication with an Interpersonal emphasis under the 2006-07 catalog. Students may consider a double emphasis in communication or starting a double major in business or in psychology/behavioral science. Both of these double major areas double dip enough that they can still be completed in four years assuming they choose their elective hours such that they work in both programs. If students elect not to do a double major, helpful minors include history, graphic design, business, Spanish, English and theology/Biblical languages.

Courses are offered on a rotating basis refer to the 5 year course offerings for each area.

All degrees require at least 128 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative grade average of “C” (2.00) or the minimum grade average specified by individual program requirements (if higher). A minimum of 30 semester hours (12 of which must be on the 300 & 400 level and 15 of which must be in the student’s major) must be taken in residence.

A second bachelor’s degree requires an additional 30 semester hours above the 128 hours.
