

Off Campus Eligibility for 2024-25 Year

Full-time undergraduate students at Concordia University, Nebraska are required to live on campus unless they meet one or more of the following off-campus eligibility requirements.

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO LIVE OFF CAMPUS IF...

- You will be 21 years old by December 31, 2024 - CHANGE FOR 24-25 ACADEMIC YEAR
- You transferred to Concordia Nebraska with a completed associate degree
- You are married before the semester begins
- You are supporting your own child at your residence
- You live at home with your parent(s) at their primary residence within Seward County

Eligible students must complete an off-campus housing form each year to communicate their intent to live off campus and to collect important information in case of emergency.

OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING EXCEPTIONS

Requests for an exception to live off campus for any other reason besides those listed above must be made to the Vice President for Student Affairs. Appeal forms will be sent to students via email January 24 or are available after that date by emailing SLOhousing@cune.edu.

Exceptions to the On-Campus Residence Requirement are granted due to unusual circumstances that would not be common to other students. Financial need is generally not a unique circumstance that qualifies for an exception.

Falsifying information, choosing to reside off-campus without permission, and/or non-compliance with guidelines allowing the exception may result in disciplinary consequences to the student, including but not limited to, being assessed the full room and board rate.

HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR MEDICAL NEEDS

We provide accommodations for students with disabilities in order to facilitate their full participation in our housing program. Concordia's obligation is to include students on campus and accommodate their needs within university housing whenever possible.

Because of this, if a student's need meets the requirements of an accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and is unable to be accommodated within our residence halls, only then will off-campus accommodation options be explored. Requests for housing accommodations due to medical need are processed through our ADA office.

FINANCIAL AID AND OFF CAMPUS EXCEPTIONS

The University's scholarship and grant program packages are generally designed to assist students with tuition, room, and board. Therefore, students who request an exception to the On-Campus Residence Requirement and are approved will have a \$2000 reduction in their annual university financial aid offer. Please note that this shows up on the bill as a \$1000/semester "fee" instead of an annual "reduction". The reason for this is so the fee can be removed once they become eligible to live off campus, which could not happen if it was processed as a reduction.
