Transfer Guide



Students anticipating transferring to Concordia University may use this guide for selecting Northeast Community College courses. Students should communicate with the Concordia University Office of the Registrar to confirm course selections.

Within the hours required for graduation each student completes a general education program. Students are required to meet the specific hours in each of these general education requirements. The minimum number of hours may be exceeded depending on the courses a student chooses.

To be admitted, transfer students must be in good standing and have a 2.00 or higher grade point average on a 4.00 scale at the institution from which they are transferring. A maximum of 70 semester hours will be accepted for transfer from a two-year institution. A grade of C- or above must be received in each course accepted for transfer credit. Students who have completed an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science shall be considered to have completed all general education requirements except for religion and theology.
