SCHOOL BENEFITS

COURSE STIPEND

Schools receive a \$560 stipend per course.

CONTINUING EDUCATION SUPPORT

Graduate Tuition Waiver: Schools receive a Concordia Nebraska graduate course waiver for every 50 credits of student registrations.

Subject Area Mastery Scholarships:

Concordia provides scholarships up to \$300/ credit for teachers to earn the requisite graduate hours to offer dual credit in their content area.

REQUIREMENTS

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

- Juniors/seniors: 3.0 GPA automatic, or 2.50 2.99 GPA with parent permission
- Freshmen/sophomores: 3.0 GPA, parent permission, and administrative approval

FACULTY ELIGIBILITY

- · Master's degree in the field
- Any Master's degree plus 18 graduate hours in the field, including content-area methods courses
- Tested experience or industry certifications in foreign language and professional/ technical fields
