## **Calculations for Measures**

MEASURE	DESCRIPTION AND HOW IT WAS CALCULATED
Graduation rate	Graduation rate is the percentage of a school's first-time, first- year undergraduate students who complete their program within 150% of the published time for the program. For example, for a four-year degree program, entering students who complete within six years are counted as graduates. So for a 36-credit masters designed for working adults taking one 3-credit course at a time, with six 8-week courses per year, the "published" time (even though one is not published) to complete is figured here to be 2 years. 150% of 2 years is 3 years.
