

This lyrical, empowering poem celebrates black children and seeks to inspire all young people to dream big and achieve their goals.


It's Shoe Time-Hardcover- \$10.75






After letting his band down by missing rehearsal, Shorty has some serious questions about what it means to be a leader. He hits the streets of


Ronan Boyle and the Swamp of Certain Death- Hardcover- \$19.25




Through parables of the good Samaritan and the prodigal son, the lost sheep and the beatitudes, Jesus taught his disciples the redeeming power of sacrificial love and


A little girl gallivants through a county fair, searching for her furry friend. Readers will surely spot the friendly monster as well as twenty


An old ship. A sad friend. A button . . . An idea. Let's SWAP!


Lazlo is in love. He selects the perfect red rose and sets off to the theater to present it to his beloved, an actress currently starring






That is My Dream! Hardcover- \$19.25




In 1887 in India, a boy named Ramanujan is born with a passion for numbers. He sees numbers everywhere. He writes mathematics with his finger in
