HONORARY DEGREE AND AWARDS

MAJOR GENERAL K. LUKE REINER DOCTOR OF LAWS

The Concordia University, Nebraska Doctor of Laws degree is conferred upon individuals who have distinguished themselves through prolonged superior service in their field of endeavor.

Retired Major General K. Luke Reiner '86 currently volunteers in support of the National Disaster Resilience Council, a national organization dedicated to protecting critical United States infrastructure and the American people. Reiner retired in 2024 after 40 years of service to his state and nation. Prior to his retirement, he served as the director of the Wyoming Department of Transportation, as the Adjutant General of the State of Wyoming and as a certified public accountant.

As director of the Wyoming Department of Transportation, he was responsible for the health, safety and welfare of about 2,000 people spread across the state in approximately 60 locations. He oversaw the maintenance, repair and real-time operations of about 7,000 miles of roads and 2,000 bridges and was responsible for the efficient and reliable operations of the Wyoming Highway Patrol, state driver's licensing, state emergency communications and the state aeronautics division.

As the Adjutant General of the State of Wyoming, he served as the commanding general for the Wyoming Military Department, responsible for formulating, developing and coordinating all policies, plans and programs that impacted more than 3,000 men and women in the Wyoming Air and Army National Guard.

He began his military career in 1982 as an enlisted soldier in the Nebraska Army National



Guard, relocating to Casper in 1987 and then Cheyenne in 1998. He assumed command of the Wyoming National Guard on April 1, 2011, and attained the rank of Major General in May 2013. He retired from the U.S. Army in March 2019.

Reiner is a member of the Association of the United States Army, the United States Field Artillery Association, the Wyoming Field Artillery Association, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Wyoming Association of Certified Public Accountants and the Cheyenne Chamber of Commerce.

He chose to attend Concordia Nebraska because his great grandfather William R. Roth '10, grandmother Clara (Roth) Harley, father Kenneth Loyd Reiner '60 and mother Darlene V. (Harley) Reiner '62 all attended the university. The family tradition continued as his sister, Sharon (Reiner) Oetting '86, joined him at the university. When he chose Concordia, the university was launching a newly-developed business department, which piqued his interest. He said supportive professors fostered a culture of mentorship, encouraging students to explore their purpose and potential career options. The consistent message of service to others resonated deeply with Reiner and amplified the key values he grew up with, including Christian character, Christian morals and Christian

faith. While at the university, a fellow student introduced him to the Nebraska National Guard, a seemingly-small action that significantly impacted the rest of his life and career.

Reiner and his wife Devonna (Buesing) Reiner '87 have two daughters, Holly Flanscha and Heather O'Donnell. The Reiners are members of Our Savior Lutheran Church in Cheyenne, Wyoming, where Reiner has served as an elder for 14 years and held various offices and served on multiple committees.

In conferring this degree to Major General K. Luke Reiner, Concordia University, Nebraska praises God for those who use their gifts in dedicated service in their field. We are pleased to confer upon Luke Reiner the Doctor of Laws degree, honoris causa.

HONORARY DEGREE AND AWARDS

MARK AND DEBBIE BAACKE MASTER EDUCATOR AWARD

The Concordia University, Nebraska Master Educator Award is presented to teachers, Directors of Christian Education, school administrators or deaconesses who have distinguished themselves through prolonged superior service in Lutheran educational ministry.

Mark Baacke '73 and Deborah (Snyder) Baacke '73 have had careers in Lutheran education that span multiple states and many decades. The duo met in college and were married shortly after their graduation from Concordia University, Nebraska. The university was called Concordia Teachers College at the time of their graduation.

Mark earned an associate of arts degree from St. Paul's College in Concordia, Missouri, a bachelor's degree in secondary education from Concordia Teachers College with a major in biology and minor in math and a master's degree in secondary science education from the University of Houston in Houston, Texas.

In 2020, Mark retired following 45 years of service at Lutheran South Academy – which was also at various points called Lutheran High School and Lutheran High South - in Houston, Texas. Prior to his service there, he served at Our Saviour Lutheran School in Bronx, New York. At both schools, he taught biology, honors biology and biology 2 along with a variety of other science and math classes. At Lutheran South, he was the science department chair for about 20 years. At both schools, he also coached baseball, basketball, soccer, softball and golf, and also served as faculty advisor for National Honor Society and Student Council.



Passionate about serving schools, the church and his community, Mark is known for carpooling students across Houston to attend Lutheran South, planning class retreats for high school students and serving on a Texas District of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod committee to write the first set of accreditation documents for Texas Lutheran schools to become accredited. From 2010 to 2022 he planned and chaperoned trips for Lutheran South seniors to Passion Conference in Atlanta, Georgia, an annual gathering of Christian students who are 18 to 25 years old. He has hosted weekend student Bible studies and astronomy nights for high school students and summer Bible studies for college students, painted a variety of murals at Lutheran High South and painted the school logo in the Lutheran South school gym. He served on the board of education and was the stewardship chairman at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas. Although officially retired, he still monitors AP high school exams each spring and serves as a substitute teacher at Lutheran South as needed.

He is a member of the Lutheran Education Association, the National Science Teachers Association and the National Association of Biology Teachers. Mark's parents, LeVerne Baacke HS '42 CO '45 and Phyllis (Marohn) Baacke HS '42 CO '45, also attended Concordia Nebraska.

Debbie earned an associate of arts degree from St. Paul's College in Concordia, Missouri, a bachelor's degree in elementary education with a focus in literature and a minor in physical education from Concordia Teachers College and a master's degree in educational administration from the University of Houston in Houston, Texas.

She served at Lutheran South Academy for 22 years and was one of the six original teachers to start the lower school from the ground up as a new addition to the academy. She taught first grade and kindergarten. In addition to teaching, she coached girls fifth and sixth grade basketball, girls seventh and eighth grade basketball and served as middle school principal and lower school principal during her tenure there. Prior to that, she served for 23 years at Our Savior Lutheran School in Houston in a variety of positions including teaching pre-kindergarten, first grade, third grade, seventh grade and eighth grade. She also coached basketball, sponsored the school yearbook, served as interim principal and assistant principal, coordinated student teachers and served as early childhood director at different times during her service there. At the beginning of her teaching career, she taught at Grace Lutheran School in Bronx, New York, teaching third and fourth grade combination classes and coaching girls varsity volleyball.

An experienced writer and speaker, Debbie has authored papers and spoken on more than 20 topics at Texas District of The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod educator's conferences, early childhood education conferences and Sunday school teacher's conferences, addressing topics including discipline, parent-teacher relationships, technology and more.

Active in the church and in her community, Debbie has volunteered as Sunday school superintendent and on various church boards. She is a ministry partner on the comfort dog team at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas. She is chair of the Houston area commissioners of The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod Texas District Accreditation Commission and volunteers for a community organization called Anchor Point and their House of Hope, which cares for pregnant young women.

She said the culture and atmosphere of Concordia Nebraska is very intentional in supporting faith formation. Class teaching, formal and informal discussions with professors, daily chapel and church worship all contribute to the unique and supportive campus culture. She said the office of Christian teacher class was very well taught at the university, and after a fantastic experience at Concordia Nebraska, she sought to bring that intentional faith support to her classroom and teaching positions.

Debbie is a member of the Association for Supervision and Curriculum, the Lutheran Education Association, the Association for Middle Level Education, the National Association for Education of Young Children and the Texas Association of Education to Young Children.

The Baackes attend Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas, where Debbie serves on the board of directors, and Mark has served as an adult Bible class instructor off and on since 1999. They have one daughter, Taryn, a medical illustrator who lives in Florida with her husband, Ron, and their four children.

Active in their community and dedicated to supporting the work of Concordia Nebraska, Jeff and Celeste CO '66 GR '73 Craemer have quietly but generously supported the mission of Concordia Nebraska for more than 40 years.

In their community Jeff provides a leadership role expressed primarily through his dedicated work with the Marin History Museum, the San Rafael Fire Foundation, and the San Quentin (Prison) Museum. He was recognized as the San Rafael Citizen of the Year in 2019 for his civic and community involvement.

Celeste grew up in Detroit, Michigan, was blessed with Christian parents and attended both public and Lutheran schools. She attended Concordia Nebraska and taught in Lutheran schools in Missouri, Ohio and California.

Jeff grew up in San Rafael attending public schools including Laney College and San Francisco State. Led by his parents and grandfather, Jeff became a life-long member of Trinity Lutheran Church in San Rafael where he now leads in maintaining the church and school property and buildings. Celeste joined Trinity in 1981 and has served primarily in areas of education, music and nursing home ministries. They support God's work beyond the congregation including sponsoring children through Compassion International and Christ's Care for Children: Kenya.

DEBBIE KAY BURMA DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The Concordia University, Nebraska Distinguished Service Award is given to individuals who have demonstrated the use of God's gifts in outstanding public service.

Deb Burma is a sought-after author and speaker. She appears frequently at women's retreats, conferences and other ministry events. A contracted author for Concordia Publishing House, she has authored a number of Bible study books, Christian living books, retreat kits and devotion books. She has also authored numerous articles and Bible studies published in Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Today's Christian Living, and she currently cohosts a ministry podcast with fellow CPH authors.

A well-known speaker, Burma has delivered keynote presentations for the Lutheran Women in Mission national convention and multiple district conventions. She has served as a speaker for Lutheran Hour Ministries at national and regional conferences, was a keynote speaker for the Known Women's Conference and served as a speaker for the Concordia Nebraska Women in Business Lunch and the Concordia University System Beautiful Feet Conference as well as the Nebraska District Lutheran Educators Association conference. She has given more than 200 presentations for retreats, conferences and other special ministry events in the United States and Canada.

Previously, Burma served as director of women's, children's and family ministries at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Janesville, Wisconsin, and as director of the Mother's Day Out program at Timothy Lutheran Church in St. Louis, Missouri, where she taught as well as created and oversaw new programs.



Active in her community, Burma serves on the GracePoint Institute for Relational Health board of directors, the Nebraska District of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod Wives of Pastors Care Team, the Women's Leadership Institute board as an ambassador, the Columbus Community Women's Ministry event planning team and in various other capacities.

Burma graduated from the University of Texas at Dallas in 1993 with a bachelor of science degree in economics and finance.

She and her husband Rev. Cory Burma have three married children: Christopher and Megan (Sparling) '17 Burma, Aaron '13 and Courtney (Burma) Limmer '16, and Cameron and Katherine Burma. Rev. Burma serves at Peace Lutheran Church in Columbus, Nebraska, where Deb has served as women's ministry and adult Bible study leader, youth mission trip leader and youth small group leader.
