Acknowledgment and Agreement

I acknowledge that, while service animals are permitted on the University campus in all places where students and members of the public are permitted to go, they may be specifically prohibited due to a health or safety hazard, and also may be excluded from campus, including from residence halls, if the animal poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others, the owner cannot effectively control it, or the animal is not housebroken. I acknowledge that service animals on campus must meet these specific guidelines:

- A service animal must be clean, in good health, vaccinated, and licensed as required by local law. Verification of current vaccination and clean bill of health must be provided;
- A service animal must be accompanied by the owner, restrained on a leash, and under full control of the owner;
- The owner of a service animal is responsible for cleaning up after and properly disposing of animal wasted while on campus;
- A service animal may not be left in the care of another student or left in campus housing if the student leaves overnight or for the weekend;
- A service animal may be excluded from a facility, including a residence hall or classroom, if the animal poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others or if that animal's behavior is disruptive to other participants within the facility. In such circumstances, the owner will be given alternative options for participation within the facility.
