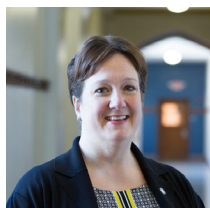

## ITINERARY

### DAY 1: FRIDAY, JULY 17

### VANCOUVER, B. C.

*Departs 4:30PM*

Among the world's most liveable cities - diverse, cultural, beautiful - this culinary capital treats you to fresh local seafood, farm-to-table produce, and authentic Asian flavors. West Coast architecture - modernism with a woodsy bent - emerged here. But while downtown shines with steel and glass, its epicenter is green Stanley Park, a 1,000-acre oasis of spectacular beaches, trails, and views. Transfer to the ship for your departure. (L, D)

### DAY 2: SATURDAY, JULY 18

### INSIDE PASSAGE

You'll sail beyond the Inside Passage into the more protected Alaska Inside Passage in southeastern Alaska. This complex labyrinth of fjords, bays, and lush green islands is home to an abundance of wildlife, including orca, mountain goats, bald eagles, bears, puffins, sea otters and much more. You'll never forget the sight of 40-ton whales hurling themselves into the air, almost completely escaping the water. (B, L, D)

### DAY 3: SUNDAY, JULY 19

### KETCHIKAN

*Arrives at 7:00AM, Departs at 3:00PM*

You've never tasted salmon so fresh. Known as the 'Salmon Capital of the World', Ketchikan is also the ancestral home of the Tlingit people, who have carved the world's largest collection of totem poles. If you're up for an adventure, take a canoe and nature trail excursion through the rain forest or a wilderness exploration followed by a sumptuous crab feast you'll long remember. (B, L, D)

### DAY 4: MONDAY, JULY 20

### ICY STRAIT POINT

*Arrives at 10:00AM, Departs at 8:00PM*

For thousands of years, the Tlingit Indians have called this place home. Located near the city of Hoonah, and home to a historic cannery, Icy Strait Point also offers travelers the chance to view wildlife like humpback whales, orcas, seals, eagles, and brown bears, or to explore monuments to the region's fishing heritage. (B, L, D)

### DAY 5: TUESDAY, JULY 21

### JUNEAU

*Arrives at 7:00AM, Departs at 9:30PM*

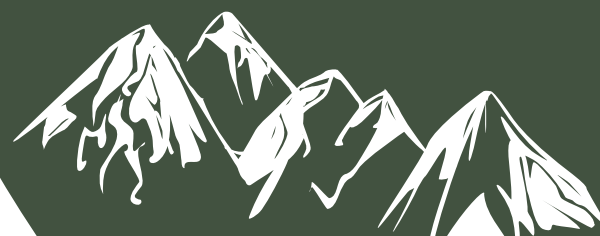
Here's your chance to take a glacial dogsled adventure in Alaska's capital, where cultured sophistication meets the ruggedness of the Last Frontier. (B, L, D)

### DAY 6: WEDNESDAY, JULY 22

### SKAGWAY

*Arrives at 7:00AM, Departs at 4:00PM*

The great Klondike Gold Rush lives on in Skagway's charming downtown of restored 19th-century buildings and its historic railway. Located on the edge of the wilderness, this small town saw its fair share of gold rush, get rich dreamers pass through. Today, you could head to Klondike Gold Rush National Park Museum for an in-depth look at Klondike and the two routes out of Skagway - Chilkoot Pass and White Pass. From the vintage train, admire the mountains and see the 1898 trail that fortune seekers traveled on foot. The White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad runs the vintage locomotives through the famously steep Chilkoot Trail and offers sweeping mountain views during its climb toward Canada. (B, L, D)



## DAY 7: THURSDAY, JULY 23 HUBBARD GLACIER

The Hubbard Glacier is located about 30 miles north off the coast of Yakutat and is by far one of Alaska's most exciting natural treasures. Named after Gardiner Hubbard, the founder and president of the National Geographic Society, Hubbard Glacier is the longest tidewater glacier in the world. Dramatically massive at about 7-miles wide, 76-miles long and as tall as a 30-story building above the waterline, it's the largest river of ice in North America. While most of the world's glaciers are retreating, the Hubbard Glacier has continued to thicken over the years and on rare occasion will partially block Russell Fjord, temporarily damning its passage. Experience the wilds of Alaska as your ship makes its way through icy waters turning from Yakutat Bay into the narrow Disenchantment Bay to come face-to-face with the towering Hubbard Glacier. The strong currents and riptides that flow between Gilbert Point and the face of the glacier cause calving to occur on a daily basis, sending massive chunks of ice crashing into Disenchantment Bay. Our dedicated onboard naturalist narrates the experience and keeps an eye out for the whales, harbor seals, and otters that hunt and play in the waters of Yakutat Bay. (B, L, D)

## DAY 8: FRIDAY, JULY 24

### SEWARD + TALKEETNA

*Arrives at 5:00AM*

Meet your Tour Director at the pier in Seward. Board your deluxe motor coach, and travel to the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. Encounter Alaska's famed wildlife up-close as you observe animals indigenous to the area before journeying to Anchorage, Alaska's most cosmopolitan city. Explore the downtown area and enjoy lunch on your own. Travel by deluxe motor coach to the charming Alaskan town of Talkeetna. The late afternoon and evening is free to explore. Stroll past Main Street's lively brew pubs and converted air streams, serving signature dishes. Take in breathtaking views of Denali and mingle with the locals who keep the backcountry spirit of Alaska alive. Overnight at the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge. (B)

## DAY 9: SATURDAY, JULY 25

### TALKEETNA + DENALI

Enjoy an early-morning scenic drive from Talkeetna to one of Alaska's most treasured landmarks, Denali. After lunch on your own at the Visitor Center, venture across Denali National Park on the Denali Natural History Tour. Discover the beauty of taiga forests and gaze at miles of rolling tundra, while searching for wildlife. After your tour, Denali is yours to discover. Book an optional land excursion (additional cost) with your Tour Director and soar over Denali, "The Great One," on a flightseeing plane, or raft down the Nenana River. Overnight at Denali Park Village.

## DAY 10: SUNDAY, JULY 26

### DENALI + ANCHORAGE

Craft your own unique Alaskan adventure in the morning, such as a visit to the Denali Visitor Center, with its fascinating natural history exhibits and films, or book an optional land excursion to visit the sled dogs of the Husky Homestead. You will then take a relaxing ride on your deluxe motor coach to Talkeetna, boarding the Wilderness Express, a glass-domed railcar, for a picturesque ride to Anchorage. This evening Anchorage is yours to explore. Overnight at the Anchorage Marriott.

## DAY 11: MONDAY, JULY 27 DEPART ANCHORAGE

Your Tour Director will see that you are transferred to Anchorage airport for your flight home.
