## Transfer Guide for General Education

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Students anticipating transferring to Concordia University may use this guide for selecting Southeast Community College courses in general education. Students should communicate with the Concordia University Office of the Registrar to confirm course selections.

Within the hours required for graduation each student completes a general education program. Students are required to meet the specific hours in each of these general education requirements. The minimum number of hours may be exceeded depending on the courses a student chooses.

To be admitted, transfer students must be in good standing and normally have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00. A maximum of 70 semester hours will be accepted for transfer from a two-year institution. A grade of C- or above must be received in each course accepted for transfer credit. Students who have completed an Associate of Arts shall be considered to have completed all general education requirements except for religion and theology.

Southeast Community College uses quarter credit hours while Concordia University uses semester credit hours. (4.5 quarter credits equals 3 semester credits.)
